- ▶ There are no daily incremental fines for overdue items borrowed at GHPL.
- ▶ The library blocks patron accounts that have \$10 on their account, and/or an item that is 21 days overdue, and/or 10 overdue items.
- ▶ Items 35 days overdue are marked lost, and a bill for the replacement cost and processing fee is mailed. The replacement fee is \$25 for any SearchOhio item and \$125 for any OhioLINK item.
- ▶ The library does not offer refunds for lost items that have been paid for and then returned later.

Maximum Items Checked Out

Patrons in good standing (owing less than \$10) may have a maximum of 100 physical items checked out at a time. This includes 20 movies, 40 CDs, 2 video games, 5 vinyl records, 2 board games. New patrons may have a maximum of 10 physical items at a time for the first 30 days. (Maximums vary for items from digital collections, nontraditional items, SearchOhio, and OhioLINK.)

Cards for Children 17 & Under

Parents/legal guardians are responsible for their children's library cards and have primary access. A parent or guardian may ask (in-person only) to grant named grandparents, siblings, childcare providers, and/or step-parents secondary access to a child's account.

Past Due Accounts

Past due accounts owing \$25 or more may be sent to a collection agency.

Lost, Stolen, or Missing Items & Cards

Patrons are responsible for all materials checked out on their card including lost and damaged items. Please report lost cards/items immediately.

Adding Users to Your Account

A patron's library record is confidential. Patrons may ask at a service desk (in-person only) to have specified users added to their accounts.

Access GHPL Online

Access your account at ghpl.org to place holds on items, choose your pickup location, renew materials, and create lists. You may also reserve a meeting room, download or stream digital media, learn about library events/news, donate to the library, and access information and resources.

Renewing Items

Most items automatically renew when due, up to the maximum number of renewals, unless requested by other patrons.

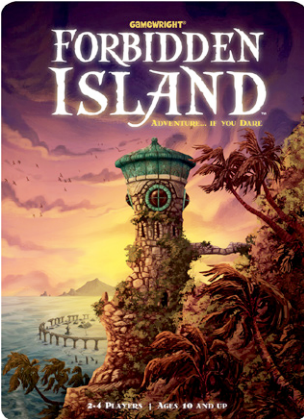

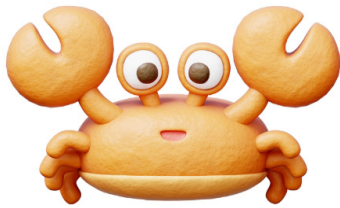

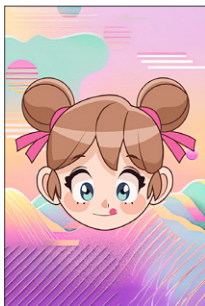

EARLY LITERACY

Diversity

Celebrated in many countries on June 1, International Children's Day celebrates and promotes the well-being of children. Designate June 1 as a day to play games, read, or explore with your child and remind them just how special and loved they are. Discuss and celebrate the differences and similarities of children from other states and countries as well!

Benefits of Board Books

Board books are especially beneficial for babies and create a positive experience with books from an early age. They are durable, provide sensory engagement with bold illustrations and/or flaps to pull and textures to feel. Ask a staff member for fun board books to check out!

Music and Visual Arts

Share some of your childhood favorites with your child—classics like *Itsy Bitsy Spider*, soothing lullabies like *All the Pretty Little Horses*, and fun, silly tunes like *Down by the Bay* are great ones to start with. You can go a step further and make a songbook of your child's favorite songs. Draw illustrations together inspired by the lyrics or the style and tempo of the songs.
