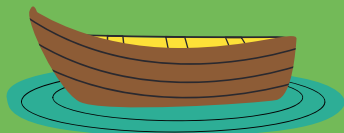

"Hot Picks" Books	7 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ There are no daily incremental fines for overdue items borrowed at GHPL, except for items borrowed from statewide networks SearchOhio and OhioLINK. ▶ The library blocks patron accounts that have \$10 on their account, and/or an item that is 21 days overdue, and/or 10 overdue items. ▶ Items 35 days overdue are marked lost, and a bill for the replacement cost and processing fee is mailed. ▶ The library does not offer refunds for lost items that have been paid for and then returned later.

Maximum Items Checked Out
Patrons in good standing (owing less than \$10) may have a maximum of 100 physical items checked out at a time. This includes 20 movies, 40 CDs, 5 video games, 5 vinyl records, 2 board games. New patrons may have a maximum of 10 physical items at a time for the first 30 days. (Maximums from digital collections, nontraditional items, and SearchOhio and OhioLINK items vary.)

Past Due Accounts
Past due accounts owing \$25 or more may be sent to a collection agency.

Cards for Children 17 & Under
Parents are responsible for their children's library cards. Only legal guardians/custodians are allowed access to a child's card. A parent or guardian may ask (in-person only) to have grandparents, siblings, child care providers, step-parents, etc. added to a child's account.

Lost, Stolen, or Missing Items & Cards
Patrons are responsible for all materials checked out on their card including lost and damaged items. Please report lost cards/items immediately.

Adding Users to Your Account
A patron's library record is confidential. Patrons may ask at a service desk (in-person only) to have specified users added to their accounts.

Early Literacy

Hit the trails.

National Trails Day is Saturday, June 6. Visit one of the city's metro parks for an afternoon. Point out items you see on your hike, and ask your child what letter it starts with. Does it rhyme with any other words? For example, "rock" starts with the letter "R" and rhymes with "sock!"

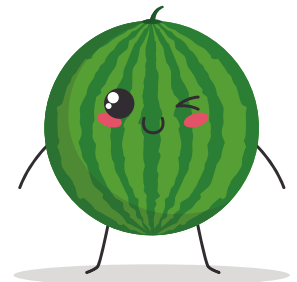


Make connections to books.

Has your child ever wanted to do something with as much intensity as Pigeon in *Don't Let Pigeon Drive the Bus?* Point out the connections between your child and their favorite picture book character. Remind them of their favorite stories to help teach important lessons and get through difficult situations more easily.

Talk about healthy foods.

Have your child pick a letter and eat three healthy foods that start with that letter. Talk about why they are good for you when you eat them.



Learn about flags.

The letter "F" is for "flag." Celebrate Independence Day (4th of July) by making a flag craft. Count the stars and stripes and discuss the colors of the U.S. flag. Find pictures of flags from other countries and ask your child questions about what they see.
