"Hot Picks" Books	7 days	<p>▶ There are no daily incremental fines for overdue items borrowed at GHPL, except for items borrowed from statewide network OhioLINK.</p> <p>▶ The library blocks patron accounts that have \$10 on their account, and/or an item that is 21 days overdue, and/or 10 overdue items.</p> <p>▶ Items 35 days overdue are marked lost, and a bill for the replacement cost and processing fee is mailed.</p> <p>▶ The library does not offer refunds for lost items that have been paid for and then returned later.</p>

Maximum Items Checked Out

Patrons in good standing (owing less than \$10) may have a maximum of 100 physical items checked out at a time. This includes 20 movies, 40 CDs, 5 video games, 5 vinyl records, 2 board games. New patrons may have a maximum of 10 physical items at a time for the first 30 days. (Maximums from digital collections, nontraditional items, and SearchOhio and OhioLINK items vary.)

Cards for Children 17 & Under

Parents are responsible for their children's library cards. Only legal guardians/custodians are allowed access to a child's card. A parent or guardian may ask (in-person only) to have grandparents, siblings, child care providers, step-parents, etc. added to a child's account.

Past Due Accounts

Past due accounts owing \$25 or more may be sent to a collection agency.

Lost, Stolen, or Missing Items & Cards

Patrons are responsible for all materials checked out on their card including lost and damaged items. Please report lost cards/items immediately.

Adding Users to Your Account

A patron's library record is confidential. Patrons may ask at a service desk (in-person only) to have specified users added to their accounts.

Access GHPL Online

Access your account at ghpl.org to place reserves, renew materials, save searches, and create lists. Also, reserve a meeting room, download or stream digital media, learn about library events/news, donate to the library, and access information and resources.

Renewing Items

Most items automatically renew when due, up to the maximum number of renewals, unless requested by other patrons.

Opera in Popular Culture

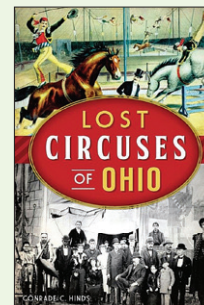

Women of the Marvel Cinematic Universe

Mondays, September 13-27, 6 pm

Celebrate the women who shattered the glass ceiling and help make the MCU one of the most commercially and critically successful movie franchises ever! As the great Stan Lee would say, 'nuff said! Hosted by GHPL staff member Lloyd LaBadie.

9/13: Captain Marvel (2019)

Carol Danvers goes from Air Force test pilot to the most powerful human in the galaxy when Earth becomes the target of two warring alien races. Features the first appearance of Monica Rambeau (seen as an adult S.W.O.R.D. agent in the WandVision series).

9/20: Thor: Ragnarok (2017)

On a journey to find the Infinity Stones, Thor is forced to fight in the games on the planet Sakaar, find a way back to Asgard, and stop the ruthless villain Hela to prevent the Ragnarok prophecy! Features Valkyrie, the first LGBTQ+ superheroine in the MCU (and Thor's reluctant sidekick).

9/27: Ant-Man and the Wasp (2018)

While Scott Lang is recovering from the events of Civil War, Hope van Dyne and Dr. Hank Pym present an urgent new mission that finds him donning the Ant-Man suit, this time with the help of the Wasp! Shows Hope van Dyne as the Wasp for the first time, as well as the female villain Ghost (originally a man and Iron Man villain in the comics).

Iconic Creatures: The Return!

Compare the legendary creatures from Universal Studios (U.S.) and Hammer Films (Great Britain) with GHPL staff members Lloyd LaBadie and Chris Boerger.

10/04: The Phantom of the Opera (1962)

A passed-over composer and his curious helper ferry away a young protégé opera singer to his sanctuary in the sewers of London. At one point, Hammer Films icon Christopher Lee was seriously considered for the role of the Phantom!

10/11: Creature from the Black Lagoon (1954)

A unique ancient beast lives in the shadows of the Amazonian jungle. A group of explorers go to study the beast in its home and decide to bring it back to civilization for fame and fortune! The most famous 3D movie to use the Universal 3D system for 35mm films.

10/18: The Reptile (1966)

In a Celtic village, locals are dying from mysterious bites, but the coroner rules the deaths as heart attacks, until a new family moves into the village and begins to look deeper. The creature makeup included molds of real reptile skin.

10/25: The Phantom of the Opera (1943)

A composer reaching the end of his career takes refuge in the Paris sewers, and emerges to boost his favorite opera understudy's career, and take revenge on those who stole his art. This marks the second iconic Universal Monster that Claude Rains has played, the first being The Invisible Man.

Eat Play Love: It's A Dog's Life!

Release the hounds! It's canine-centric cinema for the dog lover in all of us. Hosted by GHPL staff member Chris Boerger.

11/01: Call of the Wild (2020)

Jack London's classic adventure is again adapted for the big screen, this time starring Harrison Ford. Come two nights later (11/3, 7 pm: see page 16) for the Page to Screen discussion of both the book and this latest version of Buck the sled dog's exciting story.

11/08: Goodbye My Lady (1956)

Sidney Poitier has a small but meaningful role in this tender story of a backwoods lad who bonds with an unusual dog, only to learn that she has escaped from her family and they want her back!

11/15: Isle of Dogs (2018)

Eccentric auteur Wes Anderson directs this animated film about a boy trying to locate his lost companion.

11/22: The Emperor Waltz (1948)

Billy Wilder directs this semi-musical comedy starring Bing Crosby and Joan Fontaine plus a couple of amorous canines.

11/29: Best in Show (2000)

One of the funniest mockumentaries ever made, Christopher Guest's film focuses on show dogs and their idiosyncratic trainers during a national competition.
